The Plains commemorate the story of La Corriveau



Quebec City, April 5, 2013 – To bring back to mind the historical context from which emerged La Corriveau's legend, The National Battlefields Commission invites you to relive the last moments of Marie-Josephte Corriveau by attending a guided commemorative activity, next Thursday April 18: *From History to Legend, Marie-Josephte Corriveau* (1763-2013).

By lantern light, you will revisit her trial beginning with the Musée des Ursulines de Québec all the way to the site of her execution on the Plains of Abraham, and meet leading characters of the period who will teach you further details about the story, including the court procedure and the sentencing of this woman who left her name in the collective imagination of a nation. To the sound of the drums and bagpipes of the *Fort St. Andrew's Garrison of the 78th Fraser Highlanders of Québec*, a parade will march towards the Joan of Arc Garden then carry La Corriveau's cage to the Discovery Pavilion of the Plains of Abraham.
